Coach Rambles

You can now book on the coach using our website <https://www.nottinghamhframblingclub.co.uk>.

Go to the walks tab and click on the RSVP button for the relevant walk, and you will be shown more information. Click RSVP on the page of the walk you have chosen and you will be prompted to enter contact details and where you want to get on the coach. You can also still reserve your seat by phoning Gillian and David W. on 0115 9568375 if you prefer. The best time to phone is in the evening. Please give your name, the date of the walk, your contact details and the pick-up point at which you want to get on the coach when phoning them. If you turn up on the day without having booked a place on the coach we may have to turn you away. Please inform us if you wish to CANCEL your booking not later than the Thursday before the walk, using the email address or phone number above.

The cost of the Sunday coach rambles is now £13 for members and £15 for non-members. This still represents great value for money. It would be helpful if everyone could bring the correct amount in cash to make things easier for the volunteers collecting the fares at the end of the day. Anyone who comes on a walk but does not travel on the coach will be charged £5. Payment in cash should be made to the leader of the walk.

Unless otherwise stated, the coach picks up at County Hall (usually free parking), West Bridgford at 9am, Bus Stop on Maid Marian Way going North (just round the corner from Mount Street) at 9.15am, then the Nuthall Pub bus stop on the A610 going North (free parking on the slip road to Phoenix Park Tram Terminus opposite) at 9.25 am. Please specify pick-up point when booking. Pre-booking is essential. There is an option for a pick-up in Keyworth /Tollerton (pick-up time 8.40am) but this **must** be requested in advance when booking. In the event of bad weather, please contact the organiser before leaving home.

Wear suitable clothing and walking boots dependent on the weather that day.

Wednesday Car/Public Transport Rambles. Unless otherwise stated these are circular walks sometimes with an optional pub lunch. Please arrive 5-10 minutes before the time advertised for the start of the walk.

About Receiving: You're going to get it when you get home.

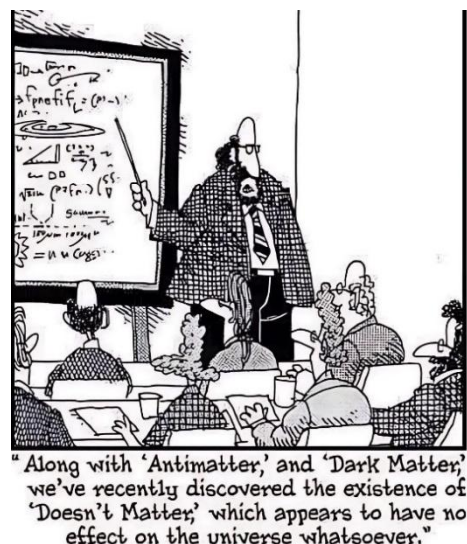
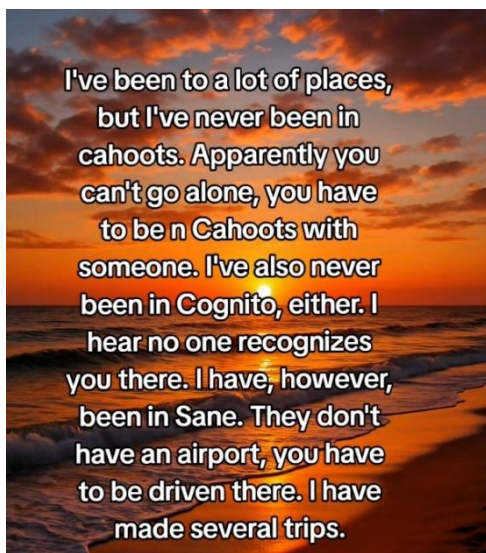
About Geneology: Shut the door. You think you were raised in a barn?

Obituary: Barbara Skinner

Barbara was born in Stapleford on 30th April 1939, having 2 older brothers and an older sister. Her Dad went off with the BEF to France (being a reservist) later that year. She spent her childhood between her own home and her Grandads small farm on Toton Lane. I think spending so much time on the farm, from being a small child, in the countryside with the farm animals started her lifelong love of the outdoors. She rode horses, milked cows and spent lots of time in the styes with (her favourites) the piglets.

Mum at the age of 12 saw a photograph of my dad and said "I'm going to marry him" much to the amusement of her siblings. My dad actually went out on a few dates with mum's sister June (a very glamorous lady) while my mum was too young to put up any sort of opposition! Well as I said at mum's funeral, she was the most determined woman I know and I won't go into all the crafty lengths she went too to snare him! However, it included going out with a chap who fought in Korea, basically to prove she was grown up enough to go out with someone more mature than my dad. She also went about proving she could walk further and put up with more outdoorsy type hardship than any of my dad's friends and not only that was able to produce a hot hearty meal on a Primus stove. They started dating when she was 16 and married in 1959. They honeymooned in the Rhineland.



My mum attended local schools until 14 when she went to Nottingham Art school near the Arboretum. She started working in C&A as a window dresser but only a few years later moved to Raliegh and after a year or so became a office manager.

Mum was very a good allrounder with arts and crafts and made many of her own clothes and most of ours when we were children. She was still using her treadle Singer sewing machine up until around a year before she passed away.

Mum was also as you'd expect very sporty, playing many sports in clubs for a lot of her life. She was particularly good at badminton playing in quite a high league. In actual fact my conception (I'm the younger daughter) was put off a year or so as she was having a particularly good season!

Mum was involved in many political campaigns throughout her life. The most memorable of which was writing to prisoners of conscience in the Soviet Union. This came to a natural end with the fall of the Soviet Union.

My mum never flew until she was in her early fifties. Her first flight was to New Zealand to see her brothers. One of the engines failed and there was an emergency stopover in Tahiti. My mum did a lot of travelling after this, mainly to Europe but 2 more trips to New Zealand, and trips to Egypt, Morocco and Tunisia.

Both me and Liz enjoyed several individual Scottish walking holidays with her, backpacking between hostels. My particular favourite memory was staying in a Blackhouse on Berneray in the Outer Hebrides with her, Mum was in her late 60's. Mum was 86 when she passed away.

We in Nottingham HF Rambling Club remember her as a long standing member with some outspoken views on how to behave. I was once told off for using swear words in the club newsletter, but we often had amicable 'discussions' on Sundays coming home on the coach about her Christian faith and my lack of it!!! Because of her upbringing on a farm she was a very useful asset when it came to dealing with cattle on club walks. She often told some very funny stories about her past life (some of them I think a bit exaggerated) and some of them sad. Her attitude to life reminded me of my own mother's. A very strong character, lived life to the full right up to the end and would tolerate no nonsense from others.
